PURPOSE

The purpose of B.E.S.T. LEADERSHIP is to develop motivated, skilled and effective leaders who will contribute to the future growth and direction of Bastrop County.

OBJECTIVES

•Identify and select highly motivated new and emerging leaders to participate in a 9 month program.

•Motivate class participants to assume the responsibilities and opportunities inherent in the leadership program.

•Provide information to class participants on the key organizational structure within the County.

•Acquaint class participants with strengths, challenges, problems and needs of the County.

METHODS

• Eight sessions beginning in September 2016 and ending in May 2017 (no session in December).

•Sessions will be held the 4th Thursday of each month except for November when the class will meet the 3rd Thursday.

•The first session is mandatory to continue in the class. More than one absence in the remaining 7 sessions results in ineligibility to graduate from the B.E.S.T. Leadership Program in the current year. (Registration fee is non-refundable after Session 1)

•Each session will provide information on subjects relating to government, economic development, county asset mapping, civic affairs, and leadership and cooperative efforts within the County. County leaders and experts from state government will be presenters during the course. •Sessions will be conducted in various locations throughout the County.

•Upon completion of the course, participants will be encouraged to seek and accept leadership roles in the County or in their respective community.

MORE DETAILS

All applicants for the B.E.S.T. Leadership program must be at least 18 years of age.

The registration fee for the B.E.S.T. Leadership class is \$500/person. The fee covers facilitation of sessions, instruction, meals, notebook, speaker cost and any miscellaneous expenses.

Each class will be given the opportunity to identify a project for their class to complete during the year.

Class participants may self-register or be registered by a family member, an associate or an employer. Applications will be accepted at the Bastrop Chamber office. If there are more than 18 applications, there will be a review/selection process conducted by the B.E.S.T. Leadership committee to insure the diversity of the group. If not selected for the current class, the applicant will be on a waiting list that will be maintained for future class opportunity.

Team building activity, overview on quality of life elements, economic development basics, local economic drivers, taxing entities, diversity, working with volunteers and engaging citizens

SESSION 5 (2/23/2017) County Government in Action

Meet county officials; learn functions of county government, jury duty, incarceration, emergency management and more
