



Bemidji Area Fishing Report

October 11, 2017



Water temps are now in the low to mid 50's and the walleye bite has kicked into gear! Jigs and minnows are taking fish in 12-14' of water. Fish the wind blown weedlines and you should see some action along with Northern pike. The bass are still active off the deep weed edges on most area lakes. Jig and plastics are working well as well as slow rolling spinnerbaits. Crappies can still be found in 8-12' around green cabbage but some are now being caught suspended over the deep basins. Muskie fishing continues to heat up as the water temperatures drop. Large sucker minnows on livebait rigs are working in 12-22'. The leaves are falling rapidly and hunters are seeing good numbers of grouse.

Have a great day on the water and please remember to practice selective harvesting, by doing so we will continue to have great fishing for years to come!
