



Bemidji Area Fishing Report

September 6, 2017



Water temps continue to cool and the fall bite is starting to begin! The problem this past week has been the very windy conditions on a number of days that has made boat control a little more difficult but the good news is the walleye bite is picking up! Jigs and minnows working the weedlines and breaks in 12-14' have been working well as have livebait rigs and minnows. Northern pike are still active off the weedlines and working jigs and minnows are producing lots of action. Bass fishing remains solid on the outside and inside edge of the weedlines using jigs and plastics or Texas rigged plastics. The crappies and bluegills are still in and around the cabbage in 8-12'. Small jigs tipped with plastic tails slowly worked just off the bottom are providing good action. The Muskie bite continues to heat up with bucktail spinners worked over the weedbeds turning some fish. Have a great

day on the water and please remember to practice selective harvesting, by doing so we will continue to have great fishing for years to come!
