Applicant Eligibility

- ◇ High school sophomores during the school year of 2018-2019 (9th graders during application and interview)
- ◇ Public, private or home schooled youth who could benefit from a year-long leadership program and who may not currently be serving in a leadership oriented role
- ◇ Student Commitment to:
 - Attend all sessions
 - Complete related Assignments
 - Display mutual respect for adult facilitators and other student participants.
 - Learn new skills and improve self
- ◇ Completed application, commitment from parents, students and school administrator and submission of 2 referrals (forms attached to application).
