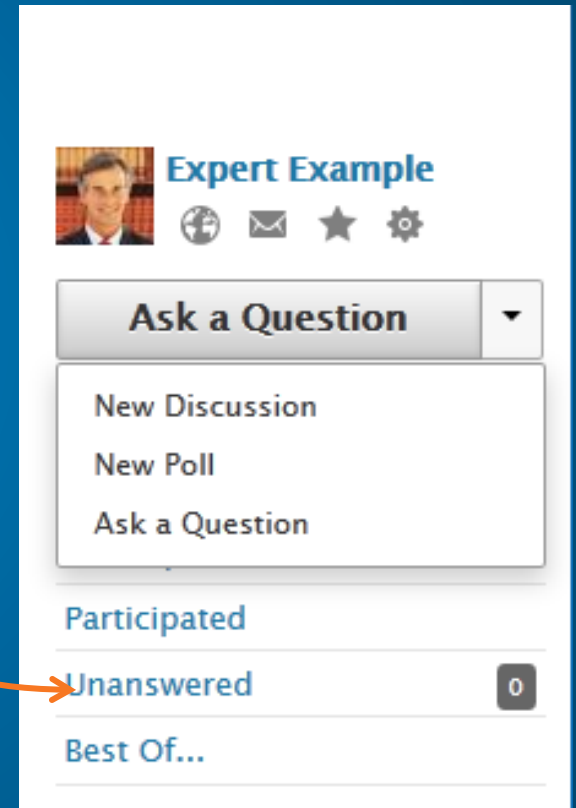

Anatomy of a Good Profile

- Share your email if you would like people to contact you directly
- In the “About Me” section, give a brief explanation of your qualifications (years in field of expertise, skill set, credentials or certifications)
- Enter your location if you would like people in your community to reach out to you directly
- Include your website so people can see what additional services you offer and how to best contact you
- Upload a real picture of yourself (earn the photogenic badge)


3. Start Posting

- Click on Ask a Question or New Discussion to begin a new thread
- Click on a category and existing thread and answer a question or give your opinion
- Click on Unanswered to see if you can address a question without a response



Asking a Question

- Select your Category
- Ask a general question in the Subject Section
- Give more detail on your question in the Body Section
- Questions should be clear and provide enough detail for the community to answer
