Frequently Asked Questions

How is the selection made?

A selection committee is established that consists of members of the Chamber's Education Committee. Each nominee is judged on criteria and not in relation to each other. Criteria include: level of commitment; demonstrated support for school improvement and student achievement; and effective use of resources that provide meaningful program activities.

Who may nominate candidates?

Any individual or organization may nominate an individual that they believe is deserving and eligible.

MENTORSHIPS

Mentors are assigned to sophomore mentees, currently in the PTECH and Ag PTECH schools. Mentors are expected to communicate with their mentees 30 minutes a week using the online program MentorPlace. Mentors are also given the opportunity to meet face to face with mentees during the school year for networking events. Mentors help guide students as they learn the professional skills needed to be a good employee. In addition to MentorPlace, mentors can participate in "Third Thursday Professional Series" at both PTECH and Ag PTECH to talk with students about diverse topics—from professional skills, dressing for success, to communication skills and technology in the workplace.

GUEST SPEAKERS

Guest speakers can be asked to attend monthly "Pathway Panel Discussions" at both PTECH and Ag PTECH to highlight each degree pathway available. You may also be called upon to talk about what you do, or how you got to your career paths to a class in the Tri-County Pathways programs.

ADVISORY COUNCILS

Participate by serving on a Pathway Advisory Council by coming together with school administrators, teachers, guidance counselors and students to help formulate curriculum for specific pathways that will provide the best opportunities for career exploration while helping to shape the region's workforce of tomorrow.

JOB SHADOWING

Single- or multi-day work experiences where students learn about a job/career by walking through the work day as a shadow to a staff member at your business.

FIELD TRIPS/WORKPLACE TOURS

Provide a tour of your place of business to students, teachers, guidance counselors, etc.

SPECIAL PROJECTS/WORKPLACE CHALLENGES

Have students take on a special project or workplace challenge – something from which you will all learn!
