Enhanced Data Security

- Transmitted data is secured with firewalls and Secure Sockets Layer (SSL) technology.
- Stored data is encrypted with AES-256 bit encryption, which means that if the system were hacked, the hacker could not see patient data.
- Data is backed up to encrypted tape every 24 hours. The backup is then replicated to the offsite data center.
