The Delegates of the 39th IBEW International Convention, which was conducted in St. Louis, Missouri, during the week of September 19 through 23, 2016, approved several amendments to Article IX of the *IBEW Constitution*. Accordingly, effective January 1, 2018, there will be an increase of one dollar (\$1.00) for the per capita that is paid to the General Fund, and therefore, the rate for all members shall increase.

For the members who have payroll deduct for their dues, your employer will be notified of this change. The members who automatically have their dues deducted out of their checking or savings account once a month, will see the increase whenever your January dues are paid.

Dear Brothers and Sisters:

On September 21, 2017 I attended the fall I.B.E.W. Safety Caucus in Indianapolis, Indiana. There were many speakers and so much valuable information shared throughout the meeting I thought I would share a little of it with you.

The one topic that caught my ear was the Cyanide Gas being released due to underground fires in vaults. There is a Local Union out of New York who has raised the issue with O.S.H.A. (Occupational Safety and Health Administration). What they are finding is that the insulation that the wires are wrapped in are catching fire and is producing the gas, putting their members in harms way. Their equipment does not detect the gas, therefore, the local fire department is also dispatched when they are because they do have the proper monitors for the crews. The Company is in the process of purchasing the correct monitors for the crews.

From what they know, the insulation is a 3M product that was used in the late 60's.

I have brought this up to the Company at the Joint Safety Meeting. Also if anyone in the Xcel's Underground Section have any information, I would love to hear from you.

The Caucus ended on a very sad note. As of that date, the I.B.E.W. has lost four (4) members in Florida restoring power caused by Hurricane Irma and one (1) Lineman is in very critical condition. Please, please work safe and continue to take care of each other.
