Your offerings support:

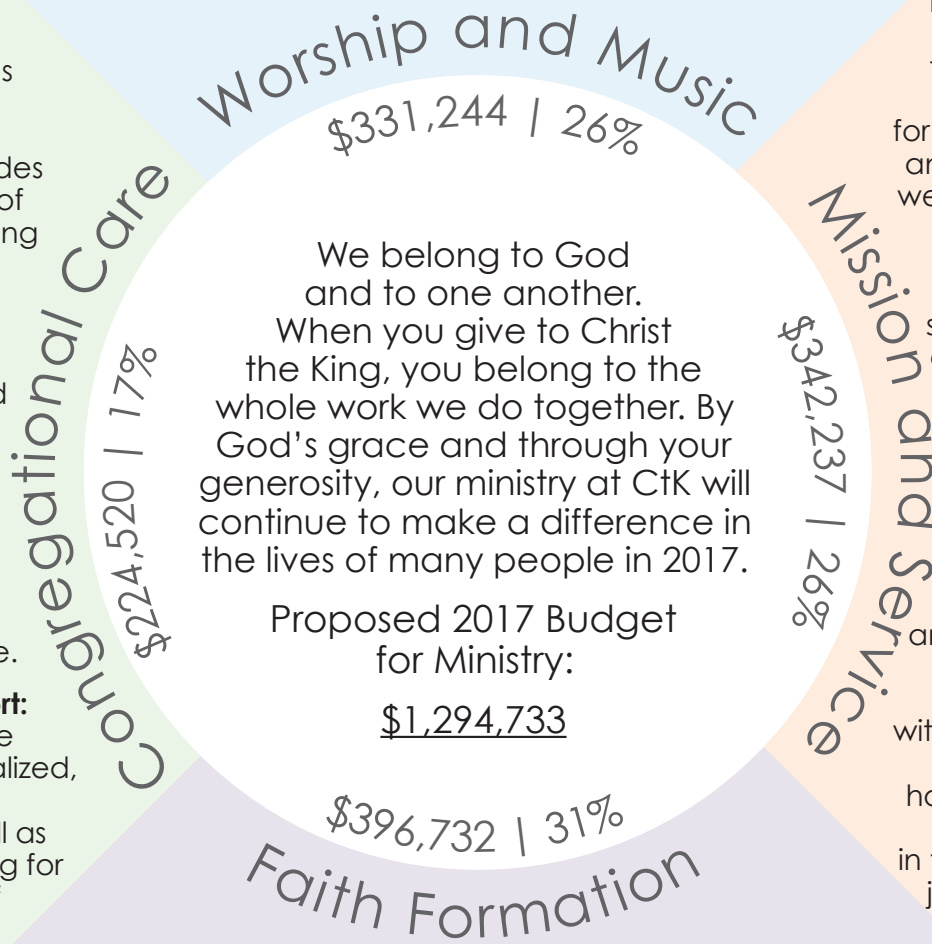

At CTK, people of all ages deserve opportunities to grow in the practice of their faith in Christ. And when we say all ages, we mean it! The 2017 faith formation budget reflects our renewed emphasis on faith formation for adults.

Your offerings support: An increasing number of adult learning opportunities, along with an ongoing commitment to confirmation, Sunday school, and other areas of children, youth, and family ministry. Curriculum, support, and the upkeep of education spaces figure here, as do scholarships for activities. In addition to full-time directors of youth and children's ministries, CTK provides a part-time director of small group ministry as well as pastoral leadership in these areas.
