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Community Leaders Join to Grow Possibilities for Mitchell

New brand designed to stimulate economic growth, build opportunities

After nearly 18 months of planning, community leaders unveiled the culmination of all its work on Thursday June 4. The community of Mitchell announced a new brand, an initiative designed to stimulate economic growth for the area.

"Cities have always been brands," said Mayor Ken Tracy. "Most of us think of brands in terms of qualities or attributes, a promise or some kind of story. That one simple perception can have a major impact on your decision to live, visit, do business or even relocate there. It is important that we understand the great qualities of our community and share them with everyone else to keep Mitchell moving forward."

The process started with research. More than a thousand residents and individuals outside the community responded to a survey about their perceptions of Mitchell as place to live, work or visit. Overwhelmingly, the respondents felt Mitchell is a friendly community that welcomes businesses, new residents and visitors alike. It also uncovered that they were not sure what all the community had to offer.

"We are a community on the move," said Stephanie Ellwein- City Administrator. "We were celebrated internationally as one of the seven smartest technology cities in the world by the Intelligent Community Forum; there are many progressive community projects in the works and our next generation Corn Palace grand opening is a part of that story too."

"It was this research that compelled us to move forward to develop a more accurate perception of our community," said Sonya Moller, chamber director. "Mitchell is a dynamic and surprising community, but we realized we were not doing as much as we could to share that story, so we created a brand we can all live every day."

A brand is the foundation that helps to make a place desirable as a business location, visitor destination or a place to call home. Development of a brand strategy for a city leverages the features of that place to provide a relevant and compelling promise to a target audience.

"This is not an ad campaign or a tagline," said Brian Klock, owner Klock Werks. "Rather, the branding strategy is a deeper, more emotionally shared vision that influences actions. The branding initiative serves as a hub to carry us as a united front for the next decade and beyond. There are many reasons why it is critical for us to have a brand strategy, but the most common is to stimulate economic growth."

The community's new tagline, Outside Expectations, is a natural extension of Mitchell's essence. Outdoor recreation and natural beauty are key parts of Mitchell's identity. It is an outstanding community whose residents outthink, outproduce and outperform others.

Our 15 member working group from across the community representing 35 organizations, devoted 870 volunteer hours over the last year to this project. Over the summer the group will be rolling out additional items painting the community with its new identity.

The hope of the working group is to shift the perception, create a common vision for the future of the community and its potential, provide a consistent representation of the community, enhance its local, regional and national awareness, and position and shed any unfavorable stereotypes.

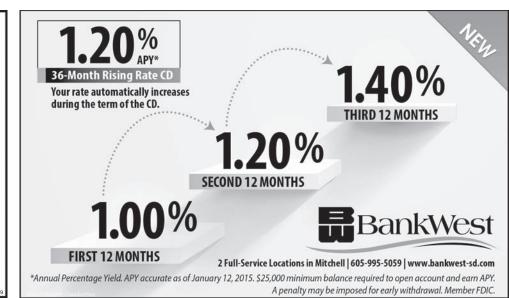

The 45th Annual Corn Palace Stampede Rodeo will be held July 16-19 at the Horseman's Sports Arena just north of Mitchell. In addition to the main event, beginning at 8 p.m. each night, several other events are planned for 'Rodeo Week.'

Everyone is welcome to attend the Rodeo Mixer, a free dinner to celebrate the rodeo, at 5 p.m. at the Horseman's Sports Arena on Tuesday, July 14, and then stick around that night for NBRA Barrel Racing at 7:00 p.m. On Wednesday, July 15, grab your clubs and head out to Lakeview Golf Course for the Midcontinent Rodeo Golf Classic, and later that afternoon celebrate Badger Clark at the Dakota Discovery Museum. The annual Rodeo Parade will begin at 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, July 18, on Mitchell's Historic Main Street. This year's theme is "Home Grown."

Sunday begins with Cowboy Church Service at 10 a.m. at the rodeo grounds, followed by the Chili Cook-off and Family Fun Day at 11 a.m. This year's Family Fun Day will include wagon rides, inflatables, train rides, face painting, family games, hot dogs, and snow cones for the kids and is sponsored by Midcontinent Communications and KMIT. All Family Fun Day activities are free and open to the public. That evening, return to the rodeo grounds and catch the final performance, where guests are encouraged to wear purple to help raise funds for the "Man Up Crusade" program.

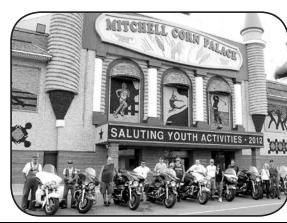
Archeologists at the Mitchell Prehistoric Indian Village

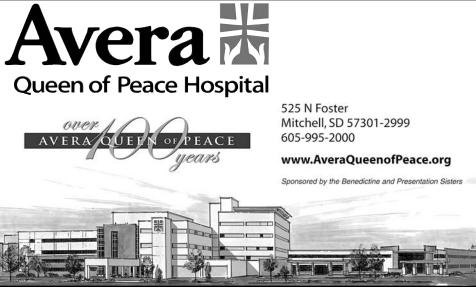
Annual Sturgis Biker Welcome

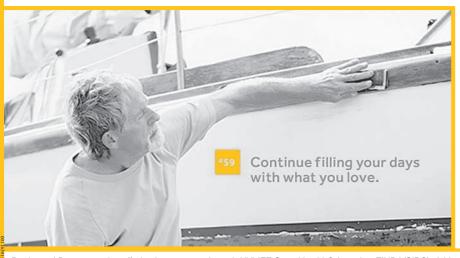
