Here are answers to some of the common questions visitors have asked.

under construction. Is it open?

Yes! The Corn Palace will remain open throughout the renovations. From now until Labor Day, it is open 7 days a week from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m.

How do I get to the Corn murals, a new sign, custom Palace?

Visitors will typically take Exit 332 from I-90 (nearly all of our guests are traveling west). From Exit 332, turn right onto Burr Street; take a left at Haven's, a right on Sanborn, and another right onto 7th Avenue. Two large, free parking lots are available for our guests, allowing them to see the front of the Corn Palace as they approach.

What entrance do we use?

During construction, visitors can enter the Corn Palace on the south (6th Avenue) side. Walkways have been set up just outside the active construction and decorating zones to ensure
