Re: Permanent Implementation of Morgan Hill Downtown Complete Streets

Dear Elected and Appointed Representatives,

From the beginning of the Complete Streets Pilot Project we stated that our biggest concern would be the potential consequences, positive or negative, for the businesses most directly affected by the proposed change.

Attached to this letter are a spreadsheet and graphs illustrating the detailed feedback we received through a targeted survey of the downtown businesses. Our methodology was to hand deliver one paper survey to each business in and immediately adjacent to the downtown core. The survey was delivered on July 9th with a return postmark deadline of July 17, 2015. These dates were chosen to be as close as possible to the end of the trial period and before the Monterey Road construction projects got underway. Forty-four businesses responded, thirty-five of which identified themselves and nine of whom chose to remain anonymous. We delivered seventy three surveys, so this represents a 60% survey response rate.

As you can see from the attached information, thirty out of the forty-four (68%) of the businesses reported that their customer's response to the road change has been highly negative while only three (7%) reported that their customer's response has been highly positive. Summing up all considerations, 64% of the businesses oppose making the lane changes permanent, 11% are still undecided, and 25% support permanent implementation.

Given this feedback, the Morgan Hill Chamber of Commerce recommends returning Monterey Road to two mixed use (vehicles and bicycles) lanes in each direction at the earliest possible moment. We further suggest that other traffic calming and safety measures (such as better indicated cross walks, heightened speed limit enforcement, and similar reasonable measures) be considered for implementation as part of the streetscape improvements program presently under way and/or at a future time.





Prelimary Summary of Downtown Business Paper Survey Regarding Complete Streets Pilot

Deadline to mail surveys was July 19. This report summarizes data received as of July 20th

One form each was hand delivered to the businesses in and immediately adjacent to the downtown core by door-to-door canvasing.

Surveys were a simple one-page paper form and inclused a self-addressed, stamped envelope to make completion and return as easy as possible Every effort was made to make sure people knew that we want their honest feedback whether it be pro, con or neutral.

We also stated that the only position the chamber has taken is that we want to understand any effect this work is having on local businesses.

We emphasized that all businesses were encouraged to participate and that there is no requirement or expectation visa-vis their being or not-being men

No Outside Alcohol at Friday Night Music or other public events

Dear Morgan Hill Chamber of Commerce Members,

In order to protect our temporary event beer and wine license we are obliged to make this policy very clear and to enforce it.

It has been brought to our attention that some people have been bringing alcohol, particularly harder drinks like vodka, etc., into the Friday Night Music venue by disguising them in alternative packaging to look like fruit juices, bottled water, iced tea and so on.

Our temporary events license from the California Department of Alcoholic Beverage Control specifically prohibits any form of outside alcohol containing beverages being brought on-site and also specifically prohibits the use and/or serving of anything other than beer and wine.

We will be asking our security guards to be even more diligent in checking for violations of these rules. We cannot put our operating license and insurance coverage at risk.

Purse thefts at downtown restaurants

The Morgan Hill Police Department would like to alert our residents and local business owners alike about a recent increase in purse thefts in the Downtown area. Since March there have been four incidents in which patrons have had their purses/handbags stolen while sitting at the outside dining areas of local restaurants. Victims have had their purses/handbags on the table, on the ground near them or hanging on a chair; when a bicyclist has ridden by, grabbed the purse and successfully escaped.

In the most recent incident, the victim reported a Hispanic male, approximately 18-20 years old with a goatee; wearing sunglasses, a dark hoodie and dark colored pants, rode onto the sidewalk, grabbed the victim's purse and then fled the scene despite the efforts of the victim, a witness and police. On one occasion the suspect was seen riding a "bmx" style bicycle and in all the other incidents, the suspect was reported to have been riding a dark colored mountain bike.

PUBLIC SAFETY MESSAGE:

As with most crimes, purse thefts are a crime of opportunity. Criminals are attracted to victims and their belongings that are easy and inviting. Your best defense is to take steps to make your property uninviting to criminals. In other words, the harder you make it, the less likely you are to become a crime victim.

While nothing is foolproof, common-sense precautions will greatly reduce your chances of becoming a victim. Always be aware of your surroundings and do not leave your property unattended; this will act as a deterrent to thieves and increase the likelihood they will pass you by and move on.
