One of the many thought provoking parts of my job is participating in various regional meetings and forums on topics of great local concern. Recently I (along with other locals including Anthony Eulo from the City of Morgan Hill and John Varela from the Santa Clara Valley Water District) participated in the “No Drop Left Behind, Smart and Sustainable Water Strategies” conference organized by Sustainable Silicon Valley. We learned a great deal about the wave of new thinking and new technologies being spearheaded by businesses, governmental entities and industry. Katie Ross from Microsoft detailed the extensive planning behind the current redevelopment of their Mt. View campus. A great overview photos and project description can be found on the Mercury News’ website at: <http://www.mercurynews.com/2016/01/21/microsoft-plans-expansion-major-upgrade-of-its-mountain-view-campus/> . When completed, all of the water needed for landscaping, toilet flushing and every other non-human consumption use will be completely provided by recycled water from both on-site treatment facilities and connections to the “purple pipe” network. If you look at the photos, you will see extensive landscaping both surrounding and on the roofs of the many buildings. This project is an extraordinary demonstration of what can be done.

After learning about Microsoft’s efforts, Richard Nagel of CH2M gave an amazing overview of the history of water in California and a path to a sustainable future. One shocking thing we learned is that the past 100 years in California has been an extraordinarily “wet” period in the region’s history. Examination of tree ring patterns reveals that there have been 200+ year long periods when rainfall was similar to our recent multi-year drought pattern. We also learned that the biggest water storage facility in California, by far, is our snow pack. Rising temperatures mean less snowpack over time. Nagel’s bottom line is that we absolutely must get our heads further around all forms of recycled water for various purposes as well as being thoughtful about what we use water for. As supplies become more and more constrained, prices are likely to only go up. Water recycling and reuse today is about where solar electric power was twenty years ago, on the fringe.

San Francisco’s Public Utility Commission has been out on the leading edge of water sustainable for a number of years now. You can learn more about their programs at: <http://sfwater.org/index.aspx?page=141>

Closer to home the Santa Clara Valley Water district has already invested in utility scale water recycling. Hopefully we will see groundwater replenishment soon in our area just as Orange County has been doing for years (and as have any of you on septic systems J). You can read about the districts efforts at: <http://www.valleywater.org/Services/RecycledWater.aspx>

Meanwhile the City of Morgan Hill is hard at work putting the planning and permitting processes in place to support the long term water sustainability of our city. Simply continuing to do things the same way we always have isn’t going to take us where we need to go. Fortunately we have forward thinking businesses and residents who are always up for the challenge of finding a better way.
