Last year marked the village's 120th anniversary as a municipality and we saw significant improvements in many facets of the village. There you can also see the village's first ever music video that debuted at

the chamber breakfast.

Our Office of Public Information produced the video tribute to Orland Park, enlisting the help of volunteers from throughout the community and the videography talent of Eyelight Studios of Orland Park. The response to this year's video has been great and we're already planning for next year. Village of Orland Park's Annual Report

The village introduced its annual report last year and this year we included even more financial information. It is what you would expect as a stockholder

of a major corporation as the businesses and residents are the stakeholders in our community. The report was delivered in the March 7th edition of the Orland Park Prairie Newspaper and can be found on the village's website at www.orland-park.il.us.

Accountability

The village completed its first community wide survey in 2012 and a majority of those responding are pleased with the village's direction with 91% of them recommending Orland Park as a place to live. This year the village will conduct a business survey and will alternate each year between the two, one for residents and one for businesses.

More formal affairs are calling for men to dress up and the way a man is dressed can definitely give him an edge in a competitive employment picture.

If it has been awhile since you updated your wardrobe,

you may be surprised at how fashion has changed. Here are some guidelines on what's in for menswear:

It's All About the Fit- It doesn't matter what kind of suit you're investing in, whether it's \$200 or \$2,000 it has to fit properly. We've seen plenty of guys who've bought the right suit but didn't have it tailored and it hangs on them like an ornament on a tree. And we've seen men in cheap but well-tailored suits that

look like a million bucks. A suit has to fit right, or else there's no point in buying it.

What Is A Proper and Timely Fit – A good fitted suit should hug your shoulders and when you button the jacket there should be a definition in the waist. It should make you want to stand up straight and will therefore be much more slimming. The sleeves should not be loose but conform to your arms and the cuff should come

to the wrist so a 1/4 inch of shirt cuff shows.

Finish It With a Sleek Trouser- The pant should mimic the jacket with a flat-front (no pleats), slim leg and very little break at the ankle. You do not want a lot of excess around the tops of your shoes. Think clean lines from head to toe.

Shirts and Accessories- the shirt should also be fitted and slim fit suits mean a slimmer tie. Aim for a tie that is 3-3.5 inches wide to match the current lapel styles. If you want trendy you can go with a 2.5 "skinny" tie but make sure the coat/pant compliments that look. Most suits are very neutral (black, grey, navy) so the area to have some fun is in the sockspatterns and bright colors are very in right now.

A well-fitting and fashion forward suit will definitely make a guy noticed and what woman doesn't like a Sharp Dressed Man.
