Traffic Stops

On **March 1, 2015**, while on patrol **Police Officer Duanyel Taylor** observed a black BMW commit a traffic violation at **1200 Main Street** in Over-the-Rhine. Officer Taylor stopped the vehicle and conducted his investigation; he observed the driver had marijuana on his shirt. **Mr. Markeith Brock** stated that he had a bag of marijuana in his pocket. During the search of Mr. Brock, he was also found to be in possession of a **black handgun**. Mr. Brock was arrested and charged with **Carrying a Concealed Weapon and Possession of Marijuana**.

On **March 2, 2015**, while on patrol **Police Specialist Dave Kennedy** observed shots being fired from silver Nissan at **1601 Main Street** on Over-the-Rhine. Specialist Kennedy followed the vehicle, while waiting for backup units to respond. Once vehicle was stopped, the front seat passenger, **Mr. Donique Philpot**, fled from the vehicle. While attempting to flee Mr. Philpot tossed a **silver 9mm handgun**. He was apprehended while hiding behind several trash cans, and transported to the **Hamilton County Justice Center**. Mr. Philpot was charged with **Weapons under Disability, Obstructing Official Business and several open warrants**.

St. Francis Seraph

St. Francis Seraph Church is a Catholic Parish with a variety of services and charities. The services and charities were developed by the Franciscan Community.

Sarah Center:

Since 1995, the Sarah Center has offered student/members a safe space to experience healthy relationships, develop life skills, and earn supplemental income through the sale of hand-crafted jewelry, quilts, paintings, and other items.

Soup Kitchen: (Monday/Wednesday/Friday Late Afternoons)

St. Francis Soup Kitchen offers hospitality and a hearty dinner three evenings a week for our elderly, homeless, and low income neighbors. More than 30,000 meals were served last year.

Bag Lunch Ministry: (Monday/Tuesday Mornings)

Bag Lunch Ministry provides lunches each week to as many as 600 day laborers whose take-home pay can be as little as \$35 for a 10-hour day.

Tri-Health Outreach Nurse:

Tri-Health Outreach Nurse provides in-home nursing care to Over-the-Rhine residents with serious health challenges and no medical home; it also promotes wellness through classes at the Sarah Center and in the Healthy Family Dinner Program.

Healthy Family Dinners: (8-week Sessions)

Healthy Family Dinner Program teaches families nutrition, meal planning, and cooking skills, as well as the benefits of sitting down together for dinner. It's a 'night out' with new dishes to try, and no dishes to clean up after!
