## **Theft Suspect Arrested**

District One Neighborhood Liaison **Police Officer's Jeff Ruberg and Brendon Rock** were working the Brickstone Properties detail on **November 18, 2015** and observed **Mr. Wallace Duncan** walking northbound on Republic Street in Over-the-Rhine. Officer Ruberg was aware that Mr. Duncan had open capiases, he was ordered to stop but fled on foot through Findlay Park. Officer Ruberg chased him through the park all the way to Race Street where Officer Rock intercepted him in the police cruiser. Mr. Duncan finally surrendered and was placed into custody. During a search after his arrest, Mr. Duncan was in possession of a crack pipe. Mr. Duncan was charged with **Drug Paraphernalia, Obstructing Official Business, and 4 open capiases** and was transported to the **Hamilton County Justice Center**.

Officer Ruberg along with the **Over-the-Rhine Chamber of Commerce President, Ms. Emilie Johnson, and owner of businesses** that were victims from Mr. Duncan's theft spree appeared at court on **December 4, 2015**, to make sure he would receive the appropriate sentence. The **Honorable Judge Brad Greenburg** sentenced Mr. Duncan to **9 months in jail with no early release.**

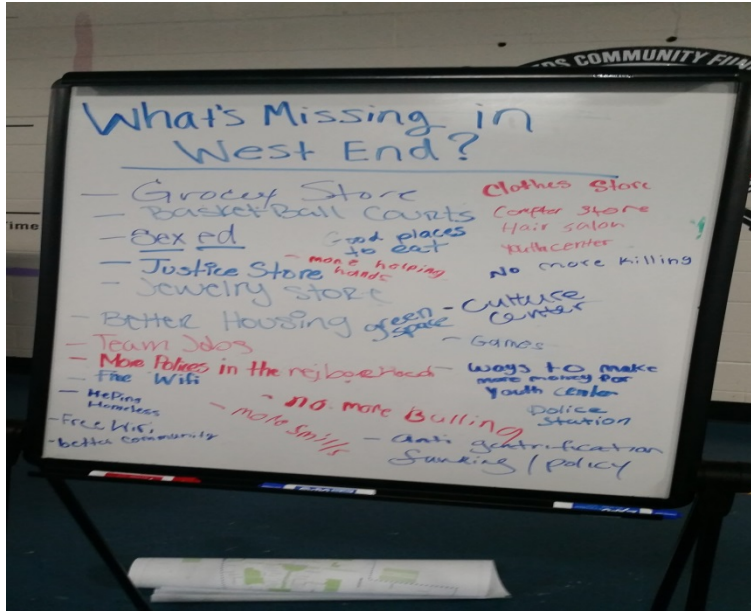

### **Trivia Question Answer:**

**The first electric streetcars began operation in 1889**, and at its maximum, the streetcar system had **222 miles** (357 km) of track and carried more than **100 million passengers per year**. A very unusual feature of the system was that cars on some of its routes traveled via inclined railways to serve areas on hills near downtown. The streetcar system closed in **1951**.

Construction of a new streetcar system, the **Cincinnati Streetcar**, began in 2012. Consisting initially of a single route, the new system is projected to open in September 2016.
