- 3) In Philippians 4:5 why do you think Paul puts these two sentences together?


Monday Night Bible Study — June 5-26



Bearing Fruit from Pastor Melissa

"Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me." John 15:4

The trees have budded; some daffodils and tulips have come up. Allergies have afflicted many as the pollen in the air has increased. We might complain, but we love the end affect: a beautiful riot of green and other colors as plants and trees come to life.

As soon as it turned warm my daughters began the interrogation of my parents who live on the farm — "Are there apples on the tree yet? When can we pick raspberries? Are there cucumbers and tomatoes to pick and eat?" It all makes me laugh because tomatoes are never asked for unless they are fresh from Grandma's garden.

We look forward to the time when plants bear fruit and God looks forward to the time when we bear fruit as well, but in order to bear fruit we have to abide in Jesus. ABIDE. Not check in for a minute or two, but abide. It sounds like this might take a while. I've always been a sprinter rather than a marathon runner so I found the following thoughts on this helpful.

Max Lucado asks the question, "How do I abide in God's presence?" Here are a few ideas:

- Give God your waking thoughts. Before you face the day, face the Father. Before you step out of bed, step into his presence.
- Give God your waiting thoughts. Spend time with him in silence.
- Give God your whispering thoughts. Imagine considering every moment as a potential time of communion with God.
- Give God your waning thoughts. At the end of the day, let your mind settle on him. Conclude the day as you began it: talking to God.

These are some good thoughts on how to abide with God daily. May you grow in fruitfulness and faithfulness this spring




bible studies

The Armed Services Outreach Committee will be supporting Flags for Fort Snelling for Memorial Day this year. According to their website, "Flags for Fort Snelling was born with the mission to continue the tradition of honoring our Veterans on Memorial Day by placing flags at their headstones. The Fort Snelling National Cemetery is operated by the Veterans



Administration with a limited number of civilian staff, thus do not have the funding or assistance to provide a flag for almost 200,000 graves. This is where we step in. We work to collect donations for the funding of the American Flags, and then organize volunteers to distribute the flags on Memorial Day. As an added effort to keep the public's interest in our mission, we offer the opportunity for those to request a special recognition for their loved one if they cannot personally make it to the cemetery. We collect their loved one's names, and provide a photo of the flag we place in their honor" (http://www.flagsforfortsnelling.com/our-mission).
