
This out of the world experience will take place August 3rd-August 5th.

TRINITY LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL <u>UNAPPROVED MINUTES</u> May 7, 2014

The meeting was called to order by President Alan Qual, with members Pastor Norm Anderson, Gina Kelly, Tracey Froemke, DuWayne Bott, Kristi Odegard, Jill Bergemann, Mary & Wally Kaczmarski, and treasurer Cheri Deplazes in attendance. Pastor Norm opened the meeting with devotions.

Stacey Jorgenson presented some ideas from Sheriff Benneweis to make the church more secure while her students are attending classes here. Stacey needs to have a plan in place by the start of school next fall. No action was taken now, and the ideas would be discussed at future council meetings.

<u>MINUTES</u>: DuWayne Bott moved, seconded by Tracey Froemke, to approve the minutes of the April 2014 council meeting. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Tracey Froemke moved, seconded by Kristi Odegard to move the line items "Honorariums - #1 and Honorariums - #2" in the TLC Memorial Fund to the "General Fund." Motion carried. Gina Kelly moved, seconded by Jill Bergemann to only publish numbers from the monthly financial report in the Ambassador after the report has been approved by the council. Motion carried. Wally Kaczmarski moved, seconded by Gina Kelly, to approve the treasurer's report as amended. Motion carried.

PROPERTY: Wally presented a preliminary draft of a rental agreement to the council. It will be further reviewed. He reported that he and Mary had cleaned the gutters on parsonage #1, and that they have some holes and will probably need replacing in another year or so. He presented an estimate from Riverside Building for the material and labor to shingle parsonage #2. The cost of the materials is \$4,063.81, labor approximately \$3,120.00, and rental of a dumpster approximately \$400.00. Tracey Froemke moved, seconded by Kristi Odegard to move ahead with the project, and to approach the congregation for fundraising and ask for volunteers to do the labor. Motion carried. Jill Bergemann moved, seconded by Mary Kaczmarski to repair the compressor on the air conditioner on parsonage #2. Motion carried. Wally also reported that the oven in parsonage #2 isn't working correctly and will be contacting Fantasy to have it fixed. Mary reported that she has been able to setup a system for Wi-Fi connections that could be used in the sanctuary, mother's room, and fellowship hall using a technology known as power-line networking. The receiving unit can be checked out through Cheri and used on an "as needed" basis, and returned to her when done.

YOUTH: Kristi reported that they received \$400 from the union for the mission trip. Kristi Odegard moved, seconded by Tracey Froemke to request permission to approach various groups for donations for Bible camp. Motion carried. Sunday, May 18 is senior recognition and breakfast, with 70 people coming to the breakfast. Captive Free, the group that was at Youth Quake, is coming to Lisbon on May 29. They have decided not to make rolls in the future. They will be doing fund raisers at the Pizza Corner on May 31, June 7 and June 14.

EDUCATION: Gina reported that next Sunday, Mother's Day, the Sunday school students will be putting on a program during the church service, and that it will be the last day of Sunday school. Vacation Bible School will be Sunday, August 3 through Tuesday, August 5 with a program presented at the WOW service on Wednesday, August 6. The total cost of the curriculum is \$66. They are planning a follow-up meeting of the Confirmation advisory committee to see what changes, if any, they would like to implement next year. A discussion was held regarding the Bibles given out to the youth and what Bibles should be used, when they should be distributed, and who should pay for them. They will be doing some research before any decisions are made. The sound system for music for the Sunday school is no longer working, and they will bring a proposal to the next council meeting for a replacement. Kristi Odegard moved, seconded by Gina Kelly, to move Sunday school to 10:15 am next year. Motion carried.

<u>OLD BUSINESS:</u> Cheri sent a check for \$3,000 to LSS of North Dakota, from funds already raised, as part of our pledge of \$5000.

<u>NEW BUSINESS:</u> Food for the Poor has asked to speak to the congregation. It was discussed and decided that there were enough local needs and to tell them no.

The next council meeting date will be June 4, 2014, at 7:00 pm following the WOW service.

There being no further business to come before the Council, Jill Bergemann moved, seconded by Tracey Froemke , to adjourn the meeting with the Lord's Prayer.


